

JOB DESCRIPTION

Job Title: DOOR SECURITY
Accountable to: the relevant RETURNING OFFICER
Purpose of Job: To manage the access and egress of all persons to the Verification and Count venue.
Principal Accountabilities: <u>Before Election Day</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Accept your appointment and read and agree to the terms of the Requirement of Secrecy.2. Provide documentary evidence to Electoral Services of your eligibility to work in the UK.3. Attend any briefing session as and when required. <u>During the Verification and Count</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. You will be required to be on duty at the times as outlined in your appointment letter – in the event that the verification and/or count takes longer than anticipated, you will be required to remain on duty until completion.2. To check the names of any person wishing to access the count venue against the list provided by Electoral Services, and mark their name to show that they are in attendance.3. To ensure that any Candidates/Agents/Guests/Press entering the count venue signs the attendance list and has their attention drawn to the Requirement of Secrecy.4. To hand out the relevant documents to Candidates/Agents/Guests/Press/Count Staff as they enter the count venue.5. Once the count has commenced, to check with Supervisors to ensure that all members of staff had arrived, and to note on the attendance list anyone that hasn't.6. To follow any other procedures as instructed by Electoral Services.7. You will be required to assist with clearing the count hall after the Verification and/or Count has finished. <u>Payment</u> <p>Payment will be made through the Council's payroll system into your bank account on the date as advised on your appointment letter.</p>

NB The particular duties and responsibilities attached to posts are of necessity in many cases somewhat difficult to define in detail, and may vary from time to time without changing the general character of the duties or the level of responsibility entailed.
