Please note that we <u>will</u> publish names and addresses of third parties who comment or make representations.

Householder applications - In the event of an appeal against a refusal of planning permission, which is to be dealt with on the basis of representations in writing, any representations made about this application will be sent to the Secretary of State, and there will be no further opportunity to comment at appeal stage.

Available Data and Documents

New Applications - Every effort is made to make the documents and drawings available for viewing within Planning Online immediately after applications are accepted. However, in some cases, there may be a few days delay as a result of workload pressure or the large volume of documents submitted with major applications. Please contact us if documents are not available.

Decided Applications - Data for applications should be available back to January 1990 and documents and drawings should be available for applications back to October 2003. In some cases there may be data, documents and drawings for applications prior to these dates but this cannot be guaranteed.
