
Awbridge parish profile

This profile provides a summary of the latest available information on the demographic make-up of the Awbridge parish within Test Valley. It looks at information on topics such as the population structure, economic, housing, health and educational information for the parish.

Awbridge is one of the 59 parishes in Test Valley. It has an area of 477 hectares which represents 0.8% of the total area of Test Valley.

Residents

The estimated 2016 population of Awbridge parish is 757. This is expected to remain the same through to 2021.

Awbridge's resident population is 52.7% female and 47.3% male.


Young people (0-19) currently make up 21.4% of Awbridge's population; this is expected to fall slightly to 21.1% by 2021.

Young adults (20-39) currently make up 19.6% of the parish's population; this is expected to rise to 22.7% by 2021.

Middle aged residents (40-64) currently account for 36.1% of Awbridge's population; this is expected to fall to 33.8 % by 2021.

Those **aged 65 and over** make up 23.0% of the parish's population; this is expected to fall slightly to 22.3% by 2021.

Those **aged 85 and over** currently represent 3.2% of the population; this is expected to rise slightly to 4.0% by 2021.



Age of parish population






Ethnicity


The largest ethnic group in Awbridge is "White" at 96.9% of the parish's population. That compares with a figure of 95.9% for Test Valley as a whole and 95.0% for Hampshire.

The second largest ethnic group (2.0%) is "Mixed/multiple ethnic groups". That compares with 1.3% for Test Valley as a whole and 1.4% for Hampshire.



Households

Awbridge parish has **279 households**, which represent 0.6% of Test Valley's 47,626 households. The household split by tenure is shown below (tenure refers to the financial arrangements under which a home is occupied








The majority of properties (79.9%) are **owned by those who live in them**. This is higher than the Test Valley average of 70.4%.

10.4% of Awbridge households are **privately rented**, and 7.2% are **socially rented**. This compares to 12.9% and 14.4% respectively across Test Valley.



Households by number of residents

43.0% of Awbridge's households are occupied by two people, and 18.6% by one person. 38.4% of the parish's households are occupied by more than two people.

Awbridge has 24 households with **dependent children aged 0 to 4**. That represents 8.6% of the parish's households.

84 households in the parish have **dependent children of all ages**. That represents 30.1% of the parish's households.

House prices


According to Zoopla, the average house price in Awbridge (as of September 2016) is **£698,042**. This has increased by 12.7% in the last five years.

It is estimated that **39.4% of households in central rural Test Valley cannot afford to buy a private property**. The central rural area includes the wards of Blackwater, Dun Valley, Broughton and Stockbridge, and Kings Somborne and Michelmersh.

Properties by Council Tax Band

6.7% of Awbridge properties are at the **lower** end of the property market (Bands A and B). This compares to 22.2% for Test Valley as a whole.

42.3% of the parish's properties are in the **middle** range of the property market (Bands C to E). This compares to 60.8% across the whole borough.


51.1% of Awbridge's properties are at the **higher** end of the property market (Bands F to H). This compares to 17.1% of all Test Valley properties.





Education

41.7% of Awbridge's residents have achieved **level 4 qualifications** and above compared to 30.5% in Test Valley as a whole. 18.7% of Awbridge's residents have **no qualifications** compared to 18.4% in Test Valley.




Employment

71.3% of Awbridge residents aged 16-74 are **economically active**, compared to 73.4% of Test Valley residents. This includes people in full, part and self-employment, those who are actively seeking a job, and full-time students.

The remaining 28.7% of residents aged 16-74 are **economically inactive**, compared to 26.6% of Test Valley residents. This includes people who are retired, long-term sick or disabled, or who look after the home and family.

Economic activity (count)




Health




Public and community transport
