
Chilbolton parish profile

This profile provides a summary of the latest available information on the demographic make-up of the Chilbolton parish within Test Valley. It looks at information on topics such as the population structure and provides economic, housing, health and educational information for the parish.

Chilbolton is one of the 59 parishes in Test Valley. It has an area of 1,268 hectares which represents 2.02% of the total area of Test Valley.

Residents

The estimated 2016 population of Chilbolton parish is 989. This is expected to fall slightly by 2021 to 976 (a fall of 1.3%).

Chilbolton's resident population is 53.2% female and 46.8% male.


Young people (0-19) currently make up 15.9 % of Chilbolton's population; this is expected to rise to 16.8% by 2021.

Young adults (20-39) currently make up 18.2% of the parish's population; this is expected to rise slightly to 18.9% by 2021.

Middle aged residents (40-64) currently account for 34.9% of Chilbolton's population; this is expected to fall to 31.0% by 2021.

Those **aged 65 and over** make up 31.0% of the parish's population; this is expected to rise to 33.3% by 2021.

Those **aged 85 and over** currently represent 3.1% of the population; this is expected to rise to 4.8% by 2021.



Age of parish population






Ethnicity


The largest ethnic group in Chilbolton is "White" at 99.3% of the parish's population. That compares with a figure of 95.9% for Test Valley and 95.0% for Hampshire.

The second largest ethnic group (0.4%) is "Mixed/Multiple". That compares with 1.3% for Test Valley and 1.4% for Hampshire.



Households

Chilbolton parish has **428 households**, which represent 0.9% of Test Valley's 47,626 households. The household split by tenure is shown below (tenure refers to the financial arrangements under which a home is occupied).








The majority of properties (78.7%) are **owned by those who live in them**. This is higher than the Test Valley average of 70.4%.

8.9% of Chilbolton households are **privately rented**, and 9.1% are **socially rented**. This compares to 12.9% and 14.4% respectively across Test Valley.



46.7% of Chilbolton's households are occupied by two people, and 22.0% by one person. 31.3% of the parish's households are occupied by more than two people.

Chilbolton has 23 households with **dependent children aged 0 to 4**. That represents 5.4% of the parish's households.

82 households in the parish have **dependent children of all ages**. That represents 19.2% of the parish's households.

House prices


According to Zoopla, the average house price in Chilbolton (as of March 2016) is **£653,492**. This has increased by 22.8% in the last five years.

It is estimated that **39.4% of households in central rural Test Valley cannot afford to buy a private property**. The central rural area includes the wards of Broughton and Stockbridge, Blackwater, Dun Valley, and Kings Somborne and Michelmersh.





Council Tax Bands



13.3% of Chilbolton properties are at the **lower** end of the property market (Bands A and B). This compares to 22.2% for Test Valley as a whole.

31.8% of the parish's properties are in the **middle** range of the property market (Bands C to E). This compares to 60.8% across the whole borough.


54.9% of Chilbolton's properties are at the **higher** end of the property market (Bands F to H). This compares to 17.1% of all Test Valley properties.





Education

35.0% of Chilbolton's residents have achieved **level 4 qualifications** and above compared to 30.5% in Test Valley as a whole. 13.0% of Chilbolton's residents have **no qualifications** compared to 18.4% in Test Valley.




Employment

66.5 % of Chilbolton residents aged 16-74 are economically active, compared to 73.4% of Test Valley residents. This includes people in full, part and self-employment, those who are actively seeking a job, and full-time students.


The remaining 33.5% of residents aged 16-74 are **economically inactive**, compared to 26.6% of Test Valley residents. This includes people who are retired, long-term sick or disabled, or who look after the home and family.




Public and community transport
