

Revised Local Plan

- Revised Local Plan submitted to Planning Inspector in July 2014.
- Hearing sessions took place in December 2014 and January 2015.
- A main modification consultation has been undertaken on proposed changes to satisfy the Inspector's concerns.
- The Inspector's report is expected in Autumn 2015.

Draft Vision statement:

Over the next 20 years, the town will evolve into the place of choice for the residents of the Southern Test Valley's small towns and villages to congregate for social interaction. The town will thrive and grow, and footfall in the centre will greatly increase, but it will retain its character as a relatively compact historic market town closely related to the countryside around it.

Empowering Communities

The Councillor Community Grant Scheme has supported various community groups across the borough with funding up to £500.

£87,249.37 awarded since it began in 2012.

The **Community Asset Fund** keeps giving support.

£349,168.50 awarded since it began in 2013.

The review of the Councillor Induction

Programme has started to improve the approach to training and development of Councillors. A session has been held for new Councillors to Test Valley, which will focus on their role as a community leader and champion.






Andover Town Centre

Encounters project

From 15th May to 16th June 2014, 91 High Street in Andover was open to the public so they could come and discuss the future of the town centre.

1,040 people visited the Andover shop and gave their views.







8 businesses have benefitted from a PopUp Shop, with 2 of these businesses now taking on long-term leases in the town centre.

Farmers' and Craft markets were held on every third Sunday of the month and will continue to run throughout 2015 due to their success.





Computers in the Community



Fortnightly sessions run to help local residents with their IT skills and to offer advice and support to those looking for a job.



Affordable homes



Over the lifetime of the Corporate Plan, we delivered **925 affordable homes**, beating the target of 800.






2015-19 – A new Corporate Plan and Corporate Action Plan




