

7.10	Land must be used more efficiently reducing need for green field sites .eg in some town centres change of use from retail and/or office, where these remain empty.

7.31-7.34	Nature has been excluded from many past plans and the environment needs protecting for future generations. Working with all interested agencies is of paramount importance.
7.35-7.39	Public open spaces and green infrastructure are so important for the health and wellbeing of local communities. This has again become so apparent with the recent pandemic. More allotments are required and spaces to walk and play. Additional mature tree coverage is required for wildlife and the environment as well as proper maintenance of existing flora.
7.40-7.47	Water is a valuable resource which needs protecting. Too much is wasted, and we need local authorities to have greater controls over private companies who are only seeking profits. Local groundwater is a better source than recycled which have been shown to still contain elements that are detrimental to health and development of children. Air quality was so improved during "lock down" but is again deteriorating so we greatly need to reduce dependency on private petrol and diesel vehicles.
