Immense change across the world has happened since the first consultation of this Local Plan document in 2018. Further change is happening almost weekly. Brexit, Covid and the Ukrainian War, conflict and refugees from world-wide unrest, drought, and famine. Since COP 26 in November 2021 there have been two of a set of three reports from the IPCC (Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change). Working group 2, published in February 2022 stated: 'It found that nowhere on Earth would escape the dire impacts, including heatwaves, droughts, floods'. *

Working group 3, published on 4 April 2022 stated: It found that countries were falling behind on the policies and actions needed to reach net zero emissions, and on current form could see temperatures rise by as much as 3C, a <u>catastrophic level</u>."*

Therefore, the Local Plan needs enough flexibility to respond to a changing world to be able to pull out all the stops emergency situations.
