I am extremely worried about the proposed number of new dwellings in the Goodworth Clatford, Upper Clatford, Red Rice areas. There is not the infrastructure to support large increases in development and nor is there any need to extend the settlement boundaries to accommodate more houses. There are plenty of in-fill sites available in these villages that would lend themselves to smaller scale development whilst maintaining the character of the villages but the suggested 110 houses at Yew Tree Farm and 75 at Manor Farm Fields (both Goodworth Clatford) to name just two of the largest proposed developments, is completely disproportionate with the existing infrastructure and nature of the village. Anything on that scale would have enormous consequences for anyone living in the areas. On several roads in the villages, there aren't even pavements, for example. With 700+ extra cars on those roads, how can that be safe for residents? The school would have to be re-sited and rebuilt to respond to greater need, in turn transforming its character and the tiny shop in Goodworth Clatford that serves the three villages would be completely insufficient. It's also completely unnecessary to build housing on this scale in the villages, given that the villages around Andover have exceeded development requirements under the previous borough plans. The villages and others like them are what makes the Test Valley such a special and desirable place to live. Why would anyone want to diminish something so valuable?
