The policy set out in paragraphs 5.185-189 of the draft 2040 Plan and illustrated in the Inset Plans, specially 1, 7 and 11 are very important for preventing Abbots Ann becoming part of Andover. Abbots Ann village is a well-defined island surrounded by countryside, with clear rural separation from Andover. The village is noted for its charm, with numerous buildings of historical and architectural importance (its heart is a conservation area). The "gap" policy (continued in paragraphs 5.185 and following of the 2040 draft Plan) has been important in resisting intense pressure for major development that threatened the separation of Abbots Ann from Andover.
