Local Plan - Upton Lane, Nursling

I am not at all in favour of the proposed plan. There are a number of issues which need addressing by TVBC:

- 1) B8 unit road infrastructure - there will be a significant increase in HGV's. At present the impact of Adnac park units is not understood, however it is evident already that HGV's have been using roads to Adnac park and of the local Lidl store in Brownhill Way to provide parking facilities for the port. TVBC need to ensure consideration is provided given the facilities for increase in HGV traffic, ensuring appropriate parking facilities without impact to the current traffic. Romsey road is already suffering from the impacts of traffic lights, further lights being installed, lack of infrastructure for the Oasis academy school, increased dwellings from the Fen Meadow and Broadmead developments, Adnac park development (ongoing), Lidl store etc. The M271/M27 roundabout is already suffering with traffic volumes as one of three major routes to access the Southampton city. There will be impacts to current dwellings located on Romsey Road, Upton Crescent and the golf course. There is insufficient evidence in the plan to understand any consideration for the increased traffic and the impacts to the current neighbouring roads.
- 2) Dwelling infrastructure - 80 additional dwellings will have impacts on amenities. Primary schools, Nursling & Rownhams St Johns, and secondary schools, Mountbatten which are the schools in the TVBC catchment area. Hospitals, GP's and dentists, UHS are at capacity and no scope of expand to accommodate the increasing population of Southampton and the wider TVBC population, in fact GP's and dentist's locally are not taking new patients. There is insufficient evidence in the plan to understand how it will manage basic amenities for additional dwellings.
- 3) Environmental & Pollution - this will result in a loss of wild lands which are habited by animals including deer, birds. The B8 units will increase light, noise and emission pollution to wild life and current dwellings. There is no evidence in the plan to understand how TVBC intend to manage these issues.
