As a resident of Nursling & Rownhams Parish I wish to make comment on the draft local plan 2040 relating to two proposed sites at Upton Lane for Residential housing and Commercial units.

Having already suffered two large housing developments within the last ten years without any increase in local amenities i feel this is one step too far.

As residents our concerns are around,

1. Lack of public transport along Romsey Road.
2. No Cycleway along Romsey Road leading to Romsey Town centre.
3. Access to the sites and potential traffic congestion leading to accidents.
4. Lack of infrastructure, dentists, doctors, school places and classrooms.
5. Landscape.
6. No footpaths beyond Upton Lane.
7. Additional light pollution from proposed housing and employment sites.
8. Additional air and noise pollution as a result of increased traffic.
9. Risk to habitat.

The draft local plan should extend existing developments within Test Valley rather than destroy small villages and parishes with limited and exhausted amenities and infrastructure.

Nursling & Rownhams has expanded far too quickly in the past 30 years and lacks infrastructure needed to cope with its newly acquired residents.
