3.91	Awbridge – Housing allocation
	The draft plan allocates 10 new houses to be built in Awbridge based on the fact that it is a Tier 3 settlement. This rather simplistic classification should not mean that it is more suitable for further development than Tier 4 settlements. The village has no effective public transport or community shop. Residents are totally reliant on the use of a car for everyday needs.
	Awbridge has seen an unprecedented increase in new housing in recent years, large houses driven by profit rather than the needs of the community, e.g. developments at Kents Oak, Banksia, Saunders Lane and Church Lane. In addition, the recent change in the Parish boundary means all the new housing in the very extensive Stanbridge Earls development are also in Awbridge.
	It is clear that a respite in development is needed for this rural community and on the basis of the extensive building that has taken place in recent years, well over and above any quota, it should not be expected to carry the burden of yet more development in the forthcoming plan.
