Stopgap Dance working with local schools to celebrate The Lights 10th anniversary



On Wednesday, 19 October at 7pm The Lights will play host to a very special performance from the internationally acclaimed Stopgap Dance Company.

Stopgap have been collaborating with two local schools, Icknield and The Wellington Academy, to create a dynamic dance performance inspired by the Moon Language signs found on the

doors and walls at The Lights.

Moon language is an additional way, apart from Braille, for visually impaired people to learn what is around them. Taking their lead from this, the Stopgap dancers and young people will dive into the world of our senses, exploring perceptions of the universe and our connection with what we see, smell, touch, taste and hear. The lines will blur as our senses overload until they collide in a dreamlike reality.
