# Update on Romsey to Abbotswood community based public art project

Nicola Henshaw is a New Forest based artist commissioned by Test Valley Borough Council to work in Romsey on a public art project 'from Romsey to Abbotswood'. Nicola's brief was to engage with and celebrate the Romsey community including the newly established residents of Abbotswood and create public art to link the two communities together.



Designs for work along the barge canal path are now complete and Nicola is hard at work creating the pieces which will be installed this summer. In the green space between the canal and the railway line there will be two benches inspired by memories.

There will also be a series of panels which will form into a mural, and which Nicola is now busy working on in vitreous enamel. She has introduced artwork created during the various community workshops run in Romsey over the past few months, and the panels also include the Romsey community poem.

### Trash to Treasure events a runaway success!

Hundreds of people visited Transition Town Romsey's successful Trash to Treasure exhibition and workshops held at Romsey Abbey in February and March. The public drop-in sessions used everyday household waste materials to create fabulous new objects.

There are a few projects lined up that we are awaiting confirmation of funding for before we proceed, but in the mean time would like to start seeing who's out there that might be interested in getting involved. These projects include:

#### **Urban Realm**

Urban Realm will be a new public art commission that highlights the pedestrian route from The Lights Theatre in Andover to the town centre. We are looking for a lead artist who is experienced in public art projects that work with light and colour, as well as leading participatory work with communities as this will form a key part of the commission.

There will also be an opportunity for an artist to be mentored and take a role in the participatory programme. Closing date **Friday 20 May.** 

**East Anton Public Art Commission**Test Valley Borough Council wish to commission two public art works for the significant new East Anton housing development in Andover. The works of art will draw on the heritage of the site as ancient agricultural land, create a landmark meeting place that is integrated into the landscape and provide focal points for communities to come together and explore.
