1. Bureau of Exchange

Bureau of Exchange - challenging our use of money

The team at Chapel Arts Studio (CAS) Andover is delighted to be launching a four week public art project supported by the CAS associate artists, and funded by the Arts Council. The aim is that residents and visitors to Andover will be inspired to consider alternatives to buying and selling; and the values we place on time and the worth of what we need or want.

Last year, a number of artists based at CAS were involved in the Encounters Arts pop-up shop which allowed them to enjoy the opportunity to think more deeply about Andover and their lives here. This year's pop-up shop challenges the use of money, and through different art events encourages people to look at alternatives to paying for services and experiences through free events to share and enjoy.

The shop's first event hosts an 'Andover Zine Fair' which looks at small publications and self-publishing led by artist Tom Mortimer. The Bureau of Exchange can be found at **2b Union St in Andover town centre**, and will be open from Wednesday to Saturday 9am to 5.30pm.

Each week the Bureau of Exchange will host a new resident artist who will transform the shop and bring Andover something new. Each project runs for 3-4 days and will include a range of **FREE** activities for all ages.

Special events hosted inside the Bureau of Exchange shop include an opportunity to create an artwork made from broken and discarded toys 'Broken Toys and Happy Hearts', a 'Swap Shop Extravaganza', a 'Food Waste Café', and an inspiring exhibition of artwork produced by pupils from Icknield Special Needs School in Andover.

Test Valley Arts Foundation book launch Celebrate Youth Writing 2015

Test Valley Arts Foundation invites you to the launch of their first anthology, 'Celebrate Youth Writing 2015'. The new book is full of poems, short stories and initial chapters of novels written by young writers aged eleven to twenty one. The launch will take place on June 16 starting at 7.30pm at The Lights. Everyone who buys a ticket will receive a free copy of the e-book.

The book entries are varied and their themes range from playful comedy to poignant tragedy, from superheroes to the ordinary heroes of World War 1 trenches, from science-fiction-style alien invasions to animal stories.


The launch at The Lights will have a showcase of poems, sketches, and 4 short films by Testbourne School, monologues from Long Overdue theatre company, a dance from Ruby Slippers School especially made for the show and original music, all inspired by the anthology.

"We want to have a fun, party-style feel to the launch. We're very keen to show how exceptional these young writers are. The stories in our book are teaching us what's important to young people in the 21st century." said organiser Cat Randle

Twenty young writers aged eleven to twenty one were chosen out of entries from all over Hampshire.

The new summer season at The Lights will see a brand new development for Andover's popular venue.


For the first time this year The Lights will be staging a summer festival, providing a weekend of events throughout the venue and outside in the landscaped grounds.


'Summer Jewels' Set to Sparkle at the Sir Harold Hillier Gardens

Once every twenty-five years for village dreamers

This year, following on from performances in 1964 and 1989, a production of the play will take place in Spring Hill Meadow.

As you would expect it will take place as close to Midsummer's Eve as possible. Directed by the author, Morag Joss and performed by amateur talent, young and old, from the villages of Longparish, Stoke and St Mary Bourne. It promises to be a magical summer event.

a-n announces new Writer Development Programme

a-n is inviting applications from members for its new Writer Development Programme. Led by freelance writer and editor Chris Sharratt – a-n's news editor – the programme is aimed at artists and arts organisers who wish to develop their reviewing, critical writing and journalistic skills. The 10-month programme will involve a variety of writing tasks, face-to-face workshops and commissions. It will explore reviewing, interviewing, feature writing and working with an editor.

There are five places on the inaugural pilot programme, and while applicants do not need to be widely published, they must be able to demonstrate a commitment to developing their writing in this area. "The programme is about writing for publication and all that involves," says Sharratt. "I'll be drawing on my experience as a writer and editor for print and online, as well as bringing in expertise from other writers. The programme will involve a lot of doing, rather than just being told what to do. If you want to develop your writing skills there's only one thing better than writing itself, and that's the process of being edited. Through mentoring, a variety of tasks and the three workshops, we'll be doing a lot of both."

Successful applicants will receive a bursary of up to £300 to support attendance at workshops and travel expenses will be reimbursed. The deadline for applications is 12 noon, Tuesday 2 June 2015.

Test Valley Borough Councillors Community Grant Scheme

Supporting local people to establish their own priorities and deliver local solutions to local issues.

The Test Valley Borough Councillors Community Grant Scheme aims to encourage community led initiatives, supported by local councillors who will play an active part in helping their communities deliver their ambitions.

Who can apply?

Voluntary groups, not for profit organisation, incorporated clubs and societies, Parish or Town Councils, Schools, in relation to their wider community role and Borough Councillors

What can I apply for?

You can apply for up to two-thirds of the cost of the project or activity. A maximum grant is £1,000

How do I apply?

Discuss your proposal with your local Borough Councillor. Read the eligibility criteria and guidance notes —and complete the appropriate application form (follow the link below)
