The Andover Foodbank

There is now a
Foodbank collection

The Trussell Trust, Andover Foodbank is designed to help individuals and families in crisis, through the provision of emergency food supplies. Local professional care-workers in Test Valley give families a food voucher which they take to distribution centres where they are given their food supplies and receive ongoing support to help them out of their crisis. The Foodbank also supports existing agencies working with the distressed and destitute by donating food in bulk. The Foodbank allows the general public to contribute to and support local well-being in a simple practical way.



Parking

Please, please, please use your allocated parking spaces to park your vehicles. Cars parked on a pavement and road side make it difficult for pedestrians to walk and cross the road safely. This can be especially dangerous for children. Emergency services such as fire engines could also find it difficult to access some roads/houses where residents have parked inconsiderately. Vehicles parked on pavements which are causing an obstruction should be reported to the police using the 101 number.

Health Walks

Health walks continue to run bi-weekly on Thursday mornings at 10.30am leaving from the temporary Community Centre. The walks take approximately one hour and are accompanied by a trained Health Walk Leader. There is no charge to come on the walks. Please wear comfortable footwear and bring a waterproof coat and a bottle of water. Other health walks around Andover and the surrounding area can be found at www.testvalley.gov.uk.

Toddler walks will also be starting in May.

These help fitness, encourage toddlers to enjoy walking and meet new people. They will run bi-weekly on Thursday mornings leaving at 10.30 and last around an hour (not all of the

hour is walking; we will also play some games) leaving from the temporary Community Centre. Toddlers must be accompanied by a parent/carer. Please wear suitable and comfortable shoes and bring a waterproof coat.

Walk to Work and School Week



East Anton Traffic Management Measures

A statutory consultation is proposed for a scheme to improve the setting for the movement of pedestrians and vehicles on the road in East Anton. This includes the roads near Endeavor School and Smannell Road in East Anton with similar measures on and near Roman Way and near King Arthurs's Way in Andover.

The number of cars parked in close proximity to each other and at road junctions has led to regular complaints about the difficulty in using the road. Particularly, the congestion affects vulnerable road users and large vehicles that serve the local community.

These roads area were designed for the safe movement of traffic with sufficient space for all types of vehicles to pass at an appropriate speed near houses and allow occasional parking. The scheme proposes to restore this function by introducing

- Parking restrictions on Smannell Road, East Anton Farm Road Cheviot Road, including its junctions to side roads and a short length on Sunflower Way.
- Only access for cyclists and pedestrians on Romney Road east of Herdwick Road.

The scheme in East Anton can be viewed with all the Alamein Ward traffic management proposals at the Council Offices, Andover Library, and the temporary East Anton Community Centre and online at www. testvalley.gov.uk/alameintrafficmeasures from 6 June 2014.
