As you will know the street names within each phase or parcel at East Anton are based upon themes that have been decided by the Planning Service at Test Valley Borough Council.

Phase 1A Arable farming e.g. Oat Road

Phase 1B Livestock farming and links to the historic woollen industry in Andover e.g. Herdwick Road

Phase 2 Chalk downland flowers e.g. Cowslip Way

Phase 3 2012 olympic games e.g. Olympic Park Road / Woolwich Way (shooting competition at

Woolwich Barracks) / Hampton Road (Cycling held at Hampton Court palace) and Eton Dorney

Walk (Rowing held at Eton Dorney Lake).

Phase 4 Andover links to historic Woollen Industry (Yarn / Loom / Spindle / Fuller)

Andover Adult and Family Learning

FREE courses to help you improve your Maths and English skills

If you are an adult and are interested in improving your Maths and/ or English skills, work towards a recognised qualification and help your children's Maths/English development, please come along to the Longmeadow Centre to talk to our tutors at our enrolment session on **Monday 16th September 2013** anytime between 11.00am–1.00pm – it won't take long.

These courses run for 2 hours per week during term times and are free. Some of the courses have crèche facilities for pre-school children. When you come to enrol, our tutors will tell you the day, time and venue for your course.

Other courses that we run include:

- English for people whose first language is not English
- basic IT a relaxed and friendly 5 week computer course for complete beginners/improvers.
- courses for parents/carers and their pre-school children, such as Learning Through Play, etc.
- We also run First Aid and Food Safety courses, for which there is a small charge to cover the cost of the books and your certificate.

TVBC collect kerbside rubbish from Augusta Park properties on Thursdays, alternating between household waste (black bin) and recycling (brown bin). Please leave your bin at the edge of your property by 7am and bring back onto your property as soon as possible once emptied, to help keep the neighbourhood looking tidy.

Community Travel

A Community Travel Plan meeting was held in June at the Community Centre. Residents discussed the new bus route and community transport trip.

Andover Bus Station

Work is continuing at Andover Bus Station. The former Shopmobility building, entrance canopy to the Chantry Centre and bus stands have been demolished. Scaffolding has been erected around the entrance to the Chantry Centre to maintain a safe walkway for shoppers and workers.

Contractor, Osborne, has been keeping local businesses and residents informed of its work programme and has placed two notices detailing works at the entrance of the Chantry Centre.

In addition to the three temporary bus shelters erected for the duration of the works to the bus station, there will be two additional bus shelters for services collecting and dropping off passengers at stops B and C. There will also be a further shelter at stop A. The shelters are being paid for and maintained by Hampshire County Council.

Health Walks

All residents are welcome for an hour long walk to help fitness and meet new people. Please wear suitable footwear and bring a waterproof coat or wear sun cream (if necessary) and a drink.

We leave from outside the Community Centre at 10am on alternate Thursday mornings. Dates are: 12 & 26 September, 10 & 24 October, 7 & 21 November and 5 & 19 December.

Cycle Riding for Women

The Breeze network from British Cycling is looking for more inspirational Breeze champions. You don't have to be an expert cyclist, just enthusiastic and enjoy riding your bike! Three times more men than women currently ride a bike for fun, and we want to help close this cycling gap. Together with you, we're working to help thousands more women to have fun on a bike and feel the fun, freedom and fresh air that bike rides can offer.

If you're interested in becoming a Breeze champion, you'll take part in a fun one day ride leadership course, followed by a 2 hour workshop about the Breeze network where you'll have a chance to meet the Breeze team and other champions. In turn we'll provide you with free kit, British Cycling Ride membership (worth £24), and plenty of support every step of the way. Furthermore, to ensure you're able to deliver safe bike rides, British Cycling will contribute to a first aid qualification. Once you're trained you can organise, promote and deliver your own bike rides as part of the Breeze network. We ask champions to deliver on average 14 rides over the year to local women in their area.

East Anton Subsidised Bus Pass Scheme

Parking - please, please use your allocated parking spaces to park your vehicles.

Cars parked on a pavement and road side make it difficult for pedestrians to walk and cross the road safely. This can be especially dangerous for children. Emergency services such as fire engines could also find it difficult to access some roads/houses where residents have parked inconsiderately.

As no objections were received in response to the public notice published by the Local Authority in May 2013, the Local Education Authority has given unconditional approval to increase the capacity to 300 places from September 2013 and to 420 places from September 2015.
