
#### **Community Litter Pick**

## An Update from TVBC Councillor Phil North

Due to the recent bad weather, I have had a number of enquiries about the provision of grit bins across the development. As the large majority of Augusta Park is currently unadopted, the County Council will not provide the blue grit bins that have been supplied in most areas across Hampshire. After all it is not their land.

On the plus side I have been pressing the developers of both Taylor Wimpey and Bellway to install grit bins for residents to use. In the last few months I have persuaded Bellway to install a grit bin on the slope at Jacob Close. If you feel that more grit bins are needed then do please let me know and I will liaise with County Councillor, Pam Mutton, and the developers.

On another note, I have been campaigning for further competition for broadband suppliers for some time now and have held meetings with Taylor Wimpey and the company that put in the fibre line, Independent Fibre Networks Ltd. 'Beaming' are now also providing services but it seems in practice they are as uncompetitive as 'See the Light'. I am assured that a deal is very close with one of the big six suppliers and that the key senior executives have already agreed in principle. All I can do is keep pushing and I will keep you informed of progress.

## In Case of emergency – ICE

The ICE campaign was launched in April 2005 and is to help paramedics know who you would want them to contact in the case of an emergency.

Store your emergency contact details under ICE in your mobile phone address book so emergency personnel know who to contact. If you have more than one emergency contact, list them as ICE1, ICE2 etc.

## StreetLink

The Government have launched a national helpline focused on helping people who sleep rough.

By telephoning the 24/7 StreetLink phone line - **0300 500 0914** or using the StreetLink website - **www.streetlink.org.uk** members of the public will be able to report rough sleepers. Streetlink will then refer cases to the relevant local authority so that assistance can be provided.

The aim is to prevent and reduce rough sleeping and homelessness, by identifying those affected and holding local authorities to account to ensure they take appropriate action. The new system will also enable data to be gathered and feedback given to members of the public who make a referral.

## Community Travel Plan Resident Survey

Thank you to all residents who completed and returned the Community Travel Plan survey in November. The feedback will help Test Valley Borough Council determine the effectiveness of local infrastructure and how sustainable travel can be encouraged in the future.

Resident feedback highlighted a keenness to see the Star 1 bus route expanded. Once the northern spine road and bus arch beneath the railway line have been completed a designated bus service for Augusta Park can commence.

A resident on Rake Way won £30 of cycle vouchers in the completed survey prize draw.

## Re routing of Smannell Road

We have been advised that the legal work is underway for the adoption by Deed of Dedication for the Smannell Road through the Bellway homes site. A list of remedial works, including lighting, has been agreed.

Upon completion of the remedial work and the legal documentation, adoption can be completed. This is likely to be in the next month or so.

Improvements to Andover Rail Station Complete

Works to improve Andover Rail Station have now finished. Sir George Young marked the completion of the project at a small ceremony on Friday 7 Dec.

Improvements include a new ticket hall, internal alterations to allow disabled access, a new retail unit, provision of a drop off / collection area, a new taxi rank and the introduction of a secure cycle storage area.

Since work began nine months ago, the station has also been re-painted and new lighting, fencing and signage installed.

The works have been funded by the Department for Transport, Hampshire County Council and Test Valley Borough Council. South West Trains managed the project, delivered by contractor Hollywell.

The station will now be monitored to evaluate the success of the changes. Further work to provide additional car parking and pedestrian access is being investigated.

#### East Anton Subsidised Bus Pass Scheme

#### Parking

Please use your allocated parking spaces to park your vehicles. Cars parked on a pavement and road side make it difficult for pedestrians to walk and cross the road safely. This can be especially dangerous for children. Emergency services such as fire engines could also find it difficult to access some roads/ houses where residents have parked inconsiderately.

Vehicles parked on pavements which are causing an obstruction should be reported to the police using the 101 number.
