Halloween Event

A blustery and rather wet Halloween saw the first community event hosted by the newly formed Augusta Park Community Association (APCA). Based at the temporary community centre at the heart of the major new development, APCA, has been set up by a group of residents to provide a focus for community activity.

Over 150 residents of Augusta Park braved the wind and rain to join in with pumpkin carving and fancy dress competitions, apple bobbing, a lucky dip and raffle all accompanied by spooky music and fuelled by plenty of char-grilled burgers, steaming hot dogs and warming soup. The festivities certainly saw off the worst of Wednesday's wild weather.

Stuart Armstrong, Chairman of APCA said "It has been great to see so many of our neighbours attend the event. This has been an excellent opportunity to start the community association off with a bang, and for us to find out what fellow residents want to get involved in."

Fellow APCA Trustee, Paul Blake, in charge of the barbecue added, "We're just ordinary residents who'd love to see an active and friendly community grow out of this huge development. We've got an opportunity to do something special at Augusta Park and our message to our neighbours, it's your Augusta Park, get involved!"

The APCA Halloween party was possible due to the generous support of Sentinel Housing Association and support of Taylor Wimpey who provided most of the funding. Sainsbury's at Enham Arch were kind enough to offer help towards the evening's catering.

Sainsbury's Store Manager, Andy Meechan and HR Manager, Coral Courtnell selected their favourite scary pumpkin from over sixty entries. All the pumpkins were provided free to the residents by APCA thanks to the generous support of Test Valley Borough Council and Kenyon's Farm Shop. Diamond Jubilee Woodland

Hampshire's Diamond Jubilee Woodlands received the regal seal of approval in October, when Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal officially christened the Andover site.

In celebration of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II's Diamond Jubilee, woodlands have been created across the country, in a project coordinated by the Woodland Trust. Hampshire County Council, has made the largest contribution to the scheme, creating three woodland sites in Andover, Basingstoke and Hedge End, totaling approximately 100 acres.

Joined by local organisations contributing to the scheme and pupils from schools across Andover, Princess Anne officially inaugurated the 'Queen Elizabeth Woods Andover' and planted the first tree. The ceremony was hosted by the County Council, to mark Hampshire's involvement in the project.

The Andover site, covering 44 acres, will be created in the next ten years through partnership working between the County Council, the Woodland Trust, the Forestry Commission, Test Valley Borough Council, and Andover Trees United, a schools-initiated community group.

Andover Trees United will manage a section of the woodland in Andover, bringing together the local community to develop the site. The local organisation provides school children in the area with the opportunity to take part in the woodland's creation, by planting saplings raised in their own school tree nurseries.

The Princess Royal started her visit at the Endeavour Primary School, where she was welcomed by the County Council Chairman, Cllr Andrew Joy and leader of Hampshire County Council, Cllr Ken Thornber before she met with teachers and pupils.

Town Andover, a group that is involved in various sustainability projects around the town.

Andover Garden Share is working at bringing together people with gardens which aren't being cultivated with keen gardeners who want to grow vegetables, herbs, fruit or flowers. People are matched up according to their likes and dislikes and needs.

Garden sharing can be seen as an alternative to having an allotment. It can also be more of a hobby for a semi-retired person or anyone with time on their hands who likes the idea of being helpful to someone else in the community.

The aim is to increase the opportunities for growing fresh produce locally and to get communities more joined up in order to work together to solve problems.

Reminder

We have been asked by a local resident to remind everyone that.....

"The boiler warranties that come with boilers, when moving in to a new build, are only valid after a year if the boiler has been serviced by a Gas Safe registered engineer, otherwise, the boiler company will void the warranty. So, if a boiler has a 2-year warranty for example, and it is not serviced at the one year point, the 2nd year of warranty won't be valid if something goes wrong with it".

Bus Service at East Anton

Once the northern spine road at Augusta Park is operational and / or the bus arch linking Cricketers Way and River Way is accessible to buses, there will be an improved, designated bus service for Augusta Park. This service will evolve as the development grows. The aspiration is that no home will be more than 400 meters from a bus stop situated on the spine roads throughout the development.



East Anton Subsidised Bus Pass Scheme

Residents are reminded that the developers at East Anton have funded 'Andover Area Mega Rider' subsidised bus passes for new households, which cover the Andover town area.

Parking

Please use your allocated parking spaces to park your vehicles.

Cars parked on a pavement and road side make it difficult for pedestrians to walk and cross the road safely. This can be especially dangerous for children. Emergency vehicles such as fire engines could also find it difficult to access some roads/ houses, where residents have parked inconsiderately.

Vehicles parked on pavements which are causing an obstruction should be reported to the police using the 101 number.
