Your Waste Matters!

At the moment, about a third of Test Valley's household waste is recycled. It's easy to recycle and the Council's Environmental Service are working in East Anton to help residents get started and keep on track. Stickers have been put on all brown recycling bins to remind everyone what can and cannot be collected for recycling.

What to put in your Brown Bin



It is really important not to put the wrong things in your brown bin - we can only collect paper, card, tins and cans and plastic bottles. Place your recycling clean and loose in your brown bin - no plastic carrier bags or black sacks. Your glass bottles and jars and aluminium foil can be recycled at your Local Recycling Centre at the East Anton Community Centre. Everything else (even if it has a recycling logo) must be put in your black bin.

Used batteries and milk bottle tops can be recycled in the community centre and residents can collect BHF clothes donation bags.

The 'Green Guide to Recycling' is a pamphlet, from TVBC, to provide information, advice and guidance on how you and your family can reduce your waste. It is available, free, from the community centre or request a copy from Sharon.

Disposing of rubbish



TVBC collect kerbside rubbish from Augusta Park properties on Thursdays, alternating between **household waste (black bin)** and **recycling (brown bin)**. Please leave your bin at the edge of your property by 7am and bring back onto your property as soon as possible once emptied.

East Anton Community Travel Plan

The Community Travel plan for the East Anton area has been prepared for George Wimpey UK Ltd and Taylor Woodrow Developments Ltd, who have been working closely with Test Valley Borough Council (TVBC) and Hampshire County Council (HCC).

Transport is one of the major sustainability issues in the UK, and accounts for about 20% of carbon emissions. Providing alternatives to car use and encouraging people to use more environmentally friendly transport is a key theme.

The East Anton Travel Plan should not be seen as anti-car, as travel by car is desirable and/ or convenient. The plan aims to inform residents about the availability of other methods of travel, such as walking, cycling and public transport.

Travel by sustainable modes can have many benefits including:

- Lower journey costs
- Less pollution (noise, emissions)
- Health benefits (walking and cycling)
- Creating a sense of community
- Less congested, safer roads

Travel on Foot or Cycle

Walking and cycling offers the cheapest, healthiest and convenient way of travel over short distances – generally it is considered that walking is attractive at distances up to 2 km (just over a mile) and cycling at 5km (3 miles). To enhance opportunities to walk and cycle around the East Anton area, an extensive network of pedestrian and cycling facilities have been built or improved.

Health Walks

All residents are welcome for an hour long walk to help fitness and meet new people. Please wear suitable footwear and bring a waterproof coat (if necessary) and a drink.

We leave from outside the Community Centre at 10am on alternate Thursday mornings.

There are currently 379,233 members registered with the national liftshare network and on average they each save £786.38 per year.

Travel by Public Transport

A bus service, Star 1,operates in the East Anton area, connecting Augusta Park with Andover town. This service operates every 15 minutes and is provided using a dedicated new low floor, low emission vehicle. For bus enquiries call 08451210190

The Star 1 service will increase as more houses become occupied at East Anton. Bus stops will be located within the development so that no house will be more than about 300m or 4 min's walk from a bus stop and all stops will be equipped with a shelter, timetable and route information. Andover Railway Station is on the London Waterloo to Exeter St David's Line, with direct routes to Salisbury and Basingstoke. It is situated on Station Approach, off Charlton Road and The Avenue and is clearly signposted throughout the town.

East Anton Subsidised Bus Pass Scheme

Residents are reminded that the developers at East Anton have funded 'Andover Area Mega Rider' subsidised bus passes for new households, covering the Andover town area.

Contact Sharon for an application form and details about the scheme. Once completed the application form needs to be taken to Beech Hurst Offices with a cheque or debit card payment of £10 (unfortunately cash payments cannot be accepted).

One pass is available per household and the £10 fee is payable per quarter.

Stagecoach buses are able to offer residents of Augusta Park a further 10% discount on bus passes once their yearly subsidised bus pass scheme has expired, followed by a 5% discount for the second year. Details explaining how residents can take up this offer will be provided when residents apply for their last quarterly bus pass.



Cycle vouchers

New homeowners are reminded that they are eligible for a £50 cycle voucher to spend on cycling accessories at Halfords from the developers (one voucher available per home). For details contact Sharon

Resident Parking at Augusta Park

Residents are reminded that every household has allocated parking spaces and should use these to park their vehicles.

Cars parked on pavements make it difficult for pedestrians to walk safely and can be dangerous especially for children. Emergency services such as fire engines could also find it difficult to access some roads/ houses, where residents have parked inconsiderately.

It would be unfortunate for all residents if Parking Restrictions are required as a result of cars parking on the road side.

Vehicles parked on pavements which are causing an obstruction should be reported to the police using the 101 number (some See the Light customers are unable to access this number but mobiles should be fine).



Endeavour School

Endeavour School has currently 122 children on roll with new families looking around regularly!

The temporary school building has been taken away and the land has become part of the open space for pupils.

A school Travel Plan is being developed with the aim of keeping children safe on their way to and from school with consideration given to local residents, parking and access. It is hoped that a new Preschool will open on site at Endeavour School in September 2012. This will offer Early Education funded places for children of families in the community, from the term after they are 3 years old.

Picket Twenty

The first homes have now been occupied at Picket Twenty. The development will deliver 1200 new homes overall.

The new roundabout off the A3093 has been completed and is now open.

Work has recently commenced on a bus and cycle underpass to link the new development at Picket Twenty with Andover town centre. The underpass will enable buses and cyclists to have quick and convenient access along London Road, under the A3093 into Picket Twenty Lane. No other vehicular traffic will be permitted.

Building of a new school at Picket Twenty will commence in the Summer of 2012 and is scheduled to open in September 2013.
