

Community Association at Augusta Park

It is very important that residents are involved in shaping the new community and are able to influence the way that things are done. In order to achieve this, we would like to establish a Community Association for residents of Augusta Park.

A Community Association is open to all local residents and gives them a role in shaping social, educational and recreational activities for their community. It also provides a focus through which local people can highlight any needs and issues of the new community. The association that will be formed in Augusta Park will also take an active role in running a new community centre in which it can base its activities.

You do not need any specific skills to help with this just a willingness to help and a little spare time, as there are a wide range of tasks that volunteers can get involved in. The organisation will be supported by TVBC and HCC to ensure that it gets the support and advice needed to be successful.

Resident Survey

Residents were asked to complete a survey to provide local feedback regarding the East Anton development which will help TVBC understand the views of local people.

Thank you to all the residents who completed and returned the recent resident survey, we appreciate your time.

It would have been useful to have more surveys returned, however those which were, represented 6% of households on Augusta Park.

All comments and feedback from residents have been passed onto relevant departments at TVBC for their action.

Results from the Community section of the survey are:

- 86% of respondents said they were happy living on Augusta Park and 82% of respondents said they felt safe living here.
- 66% of respondents said they thought the development was well planned.
- 69% of respondents commented they hadn't visited the community centre
- 34% of respondents said they would be interested in supporting the community.
- 66% of respondents are aware of the bimonthly resident newsletter.
- 51% of respondents said they would like to find out about Neighbourhood Watch Schemes.
- Respondents commented that not all the Street Lights around the development were lit at night.
- Respondents commented they would like to be able to recycle glass at Augusta Park.
- 100% of respondents who use the bus service felt the service was regular.
- 76% of respondents felt there were adequate footpaths and local cycle routes leading to town.



In light of what you've told us:

- Please let Sharon know if you would like to make use of the centre but find the opening times inconvenient.
- We have arranged a meeting about establishing a Community Association for Augusta Park on Monday 12th March, 7-8pm at the Community Centre, please join us.

- We have arranged a resident meeting to provide information regarding Neighbourhood Watch Schemes, on Thursday 16th February at the Community Centre, 7 -8pm, please join us.
- As parts of the development are yet to be adopted by the local authority, HCC have produced a map of the development highlighting un-lit street lights and have asked the developers to look into this issue.
- We have arranged for a mixed glass recycling bin and silver foil bin to be installed outside the community centre for residents to use.

Clean Up After Your Dog

OR RISK AN £80 FINE

Did you know that bagged dog waste can be put in a normal litter bin? There are over 500 litter bins located throughout the borough so there are no excuses for not clearing up after your dog.

It is an offence to not clear up after your dog and owners may receive a Fixed Penalty Notice of £80. Authorised council officers patrol throughout the borough including your neighbourhood.

TVBC collect kerbside rubbish from Augusta Park properties on Thursdays, alternating between household waste (black **bin)** and **recycling (brown bin)**. Please leave your bin at the edge of your property by 7am and bring back onto your property as soon as possible once emptied.

Rubbish can also be taken to the Household Waste Recycling Centre at Scott Close on Walworth Business Park.

Some types of bulky waste can be collected from your property by the council, contact 01264 368000. There is usually a charge for this service.

Following requests from residents and comments given via the resident surveys, a glass and a foil recycling bin are now situated at the community centre for people to use. This is a temporary measure until the permanent recycling centre is established on the south side of Smannell Road, once the local centre is developed there.

You can also recycle used batteries and plastic milk bottle tops at the community centre as well as collect BHF clothes donation bags

The 'Green Guide to Recycling' is a pamphlet, from TVBC, to provide information, advice and guidance on how you and your family can reduce your waste. It is available, free, from the community centre or request a copy from Sharon.

Community Travel

East Anton Subsidised Bus Pass Scheme

Residents are reminded that 'Andover Area Mega Rider' subsidised bus passes are available for new households, covering the Andover town area.

To date 105 vouchers have been issued, including renewals.

An application form and details about the scheme can be found on the TVBC website or from Sharon Goodridge.

Once completed the forms need to be taken to Beech Hurst offices with a cheque or

debit card payment of £10 (unfortunately cash payments cannot be accepted).

One pass is available per household and the £10 fee is payable per quarter.


Stagecoach buses are able to offer residents of Augusta Park a further 10% discount on bus passes once their yearly subsidised bus pass scheme has expired, followed by a 5% discount for the second year. Details explaining how residents can take up this offer will be provided when residents apply for their last quarterly bus pass.

Resident Parking at Augusta Park

Residents are reminded that every household has allocated parking spaces and should use these to park their vehicles.

Cars parked on pavements make it difficult for pedestrians to walk safely and can be dangerous especially for children. Emergency services such as fire engines could also find it difficult to access some roads/ houses, where residents have parked inconsiderately.

It would be unfortunate for all residents if Parking Restrictions were required as a result of cars parking on the road side.

Vehicles parked on pavements which are causing an obstruction should be reported to the police using the 101 number (some See the Light customers are unable to access this number but mobiles should be fine).

Endeavour School

Endeavour School re-opened for the Spring Term in a brand new building on Augusta Park. Staff and children are thrilled to be in the new building. There are currently 115 children on roll with new families looking around regularly!

Staff, parents and pupils are very impressed with the new school, resources and amenities. Tours around the new building have been offered to parents.

The temporary school building will be taken away and the land will become part of the open space for pupils.

A school Travel Plan is being developed with the aim of keeping children safe on their way to and from school with consideration given to local residents, parking and access.

It is hoped that a new Preschool will open on site at Endeavour School in the summer of 2012. This will offer Early Education funded places for children, of families in the community, from the term after they are 3 years old.

Picket Twenty

The first homes have now been occupied at Picket Twenty. The development will deliver 1200 new homes overall.

By the time that 50 homes are occupied, a Community Worker will be in post and a temporary community centre will be located at the site.

The new roundabout off the A3093 has been completed and is now open.

Construction works are continuing on the new housing and access roads. Pedestrian/cycle links, linking the new development and areas beyond, i.e. Harewood, with Micheldever Road, (and therefore into Andover Town) are in place.

Building of a new school at Picket Twenty will commence in the Summer of 2012 and is scheduled to open in September 2013.
