Housing Occupations

Latest figures obtained from the developers' sales offices showed that over 290 homes, of the overall 1,200 homes planned, are now occupied at Picket Twenty.

Development Update

Bus underpass opened at Picket Twenty

A new underpass, which provides a convenient and direct route for buses to travel from the new neighbourhood at Picket Twenty to Andover town centre, opened on 7th May.

The hourly P20 bus service, which is operated by Stagecoach with support from HCC, is already proving popular with residents. It links the new neighbourhood to Admirals Way, Vigo Road, Andover town centre, Weyhill Road, Andover Rail Station and Tesco Extra. There are also specially timed journeys to, and from, Picket Twenty, for children travelling to Winton School and Vigo School.

All other road users, with the exception of cyclists and pedestrians, are not permitted to use the underpass, which is controlled by traffic signals triggered by the approaching bus.



Persimmon are currently constructing a Footbridge over the A3093, with a path down to the Underpass. It is expected that the bridge will be put into place on the 26th of July. The bridge will be delivered and assembled at the beginning of that week and the Public Art figures will be attached to create a feature on this entrance to Andover. The bridge will

be made in two sections and bolted together on the A3093, so there will unfortunately be a reduction to single lane traffic on the A3093 for a week or so, with temporary traffic lights. The road will be closed for a very short period on the night of the 26th while the bridge is lifted into place. Persimmon apologise for any inconvenience caused. It is hoped that the bridge should be opened for use by the public in September.

The planning application for Phase 3 will be submitted in the summer and a copy will be made available to look at in the Temporary Community Centre, as well as on-line on the Council's website. Phase 3 is located on the Southern end of the site, fronting Forest Lane, and is accessed through the current Phase 1B. The landscape buffer between the site and Forest Lane has been planted in advance of this.

Family Fun Day

A BIG thank you to all of you that came along to support the first Picket Twenty Fun Day, at the temporary Community Centre on 15th June. Despite the inclement weather, the day was a glorious success. The resident's coffee group regulars who organised the event, raised £228 which has been split between Myeloma Bone Marrow Cancer Charity and the Residents Group and this will be used for future community activities.



School Update from

Amanda Johnstone, Headteacher

Time is simply whizzing by now and my feet are barely touching the ground! Members of the Governing Body, Hampshire Local Authority, the Diocese of Portsmouth and Winchester and I, are all working incredibly hard to ensure that our amazing school is ready to open it's doors to you in September.

Building

I visit the site once a week and meet with the project manager and on-site supervisors, in order to hear about the work that has taken place during that week and what is planned for the following week.

I am also afforded the privilege of a brief tour, the opportunity to ask questions and to make decisions about issues ranging from where to place the paper towel dispensers, to ratifying the images that will be placed on the internal windows and doors. My job is certainly many and varied!

Externally: The hard playground is ready, the adventure play area and amphitheatre installed and the rain has helped the grass seed on the field to grow well. The acres of block paving are currently being laid and the pathways, wild flower meadow, orchard and Early Years outside area created.

Internally: Painting is almost complete, the carpet has been laid in the classrooms, heating and lighting are in place and working throughout, finger safe devices have been fitted to all doors and the hall flooring will be completed by the end of this week. We are hopeful that the building will be handed over to us on the 29th July – then the really hard work will begin! From this date, we start an intense programme of fitting out the vast array of IT, furniture and all the resources that I have ordered for the school. August is certainly going to be busy!

There has been a slight delay to our fibre internet and telephone installation and we would therefore ask that you continue to use the email address and mobile phone number at the top of this letter for contact until further notice. We would also kindly request that you do not try to visit the school during the summer period, except for our special summer event days (see next page), as there will be lots of comings and goings in and around the school site and we wish to ensure everybody's safety. Thank you for your co-operation.

Staffing

We have now employed 2 teachers, a HLTA (Higher Level Teaching Assistant), a Senior Administrative Assistant, a Finance Officer, an MSA and a caretaker. We hope to employ a Learning Support Assistant next week and are currently recruiting for a Lunchtime Leader and further Midday Supervisory Assistants. Details of these vacancies can be found on our temporary school website, as well as Hampshire's job vacancies page if you, or someone you know, is interested in applying.

Parking

Please be considerate to your neighbours when parking your vehicle at Picket Twenty. Every household has allocated parking spaces and residents should use these to park their vehicles.

Cars parked on roads and pavements make it difficult for pedestrians to walk safely and can be dangerous especially for children. Buses and emergency vehicles such as fire engines could also find it difficult to access some roads/ houses, where residents have parked inconsiderately.

Parked vehicles which are causing an obstruction at road junctions should be reported to the police using the 101 number.

Subsidised Bus Passes

Following the commencement of the new P20 bus service connecting the development with the town centre, subsidised 'Andover Area Mega Rider' bus passes are available for residents at Picket Twenty, funded by the developer. Contact Claire for an application form and details about the scheme.

The P20, hourly, service links Picket Twenty, Admirals Way, Vigo Road, Andover town centre, Weyhill Road, Andover Rail Station and Tesco Extra.

Two drivers and an extra low-floor single deck bus are used to provide the new service.
